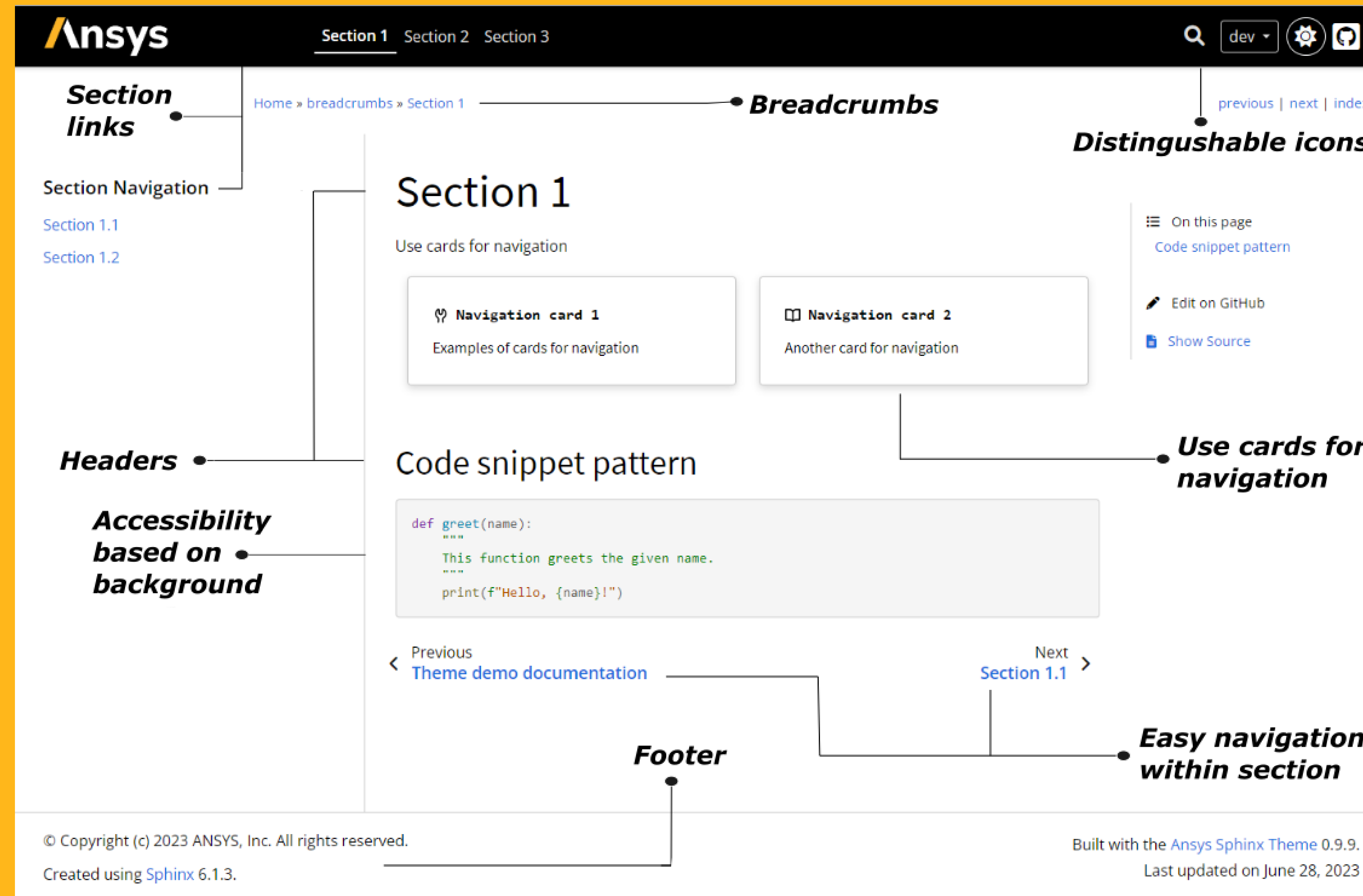
/ Accessibility guidelines

/ Inclusive visual design

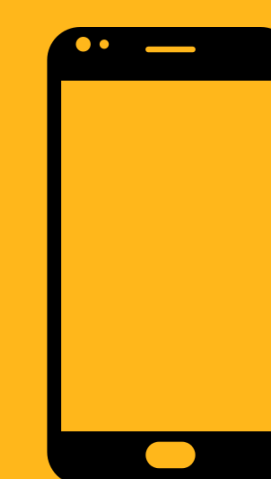
- Use clear and distinguishable icons and images
